

### **ABOUT BBBS OF ROCKLAND COUNTY**

In 1977, Family Court Judge Alfred J. Weiner requested that the Rockland County Probation Department create, with the assistance of the Court, a Big Brothers Big Sisters program. The concept would offer an alternative resource for the Court to provide help for children who were brought before the Judge as justice-involved youth and persons in need of supervision. It was anticipated that this program would prove to be an additional tool for the Court to prevent youngsters from having to be placed by the Judicial System in various correctional facilities outside of the community.

The Big Brothers Big Sisters program would supersede an original program entitled "Volunteers in Probation" which had been created to find available adult volunteer mentors for these troubled youngsters. Volunteers in Probation was administered by the Probation Department with a volunteer Board of Directors which had been recruited to help provide professional support and advice. Volunteers in Probation was eventually incorporated and entitled 'Friends of Volunteers in Probation.' Early meetings of the organization were held on a regular basis within the chambers of the Family Court. 'Friends of Volunteers in Probation' was ultimately found to be very successful in helping build the much needed self-esteem for many of the children that came into the Court.

Due to the success of the program "Volunteers in Probation," it was then decided to obtain a charter from the national organization Big Brothers Big Sisters of America, in order to provide the specialized structure and skilled professional guidance from an already experienced and established nationwide mentoring program. Thus, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Rockland County was established in 1984. As the original program entered this stage, everyone knew that the service was excellent, and there were predictions that now many more adults would volunteer to mentor disadvantaged children, and that it would be easier to obtain more funding.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Rockland County is now an accomplished program which has grown by leaps and bounds in its service delivery. It was recently recognized by the national federation, Big Brothers Big Sisters of America, for the significant increase in the number of children served and consequently, inducted into the National Hall of Fame, along with various federal, state and local awards.



# **PROGRAMS**



BBBS collaborates with Rockland County Family Court and youth social service organizations throughout all Rockland County communities. Within our site-based programs, mentors are able to meet in a structured environment with youth, to employ life-building skills in preparation for careers and healthy life change behaviors.

Many relationships between Bigs and Littles fall under our Community-Based programs. These are one-to-one outings and activities, doing things they enjoy together.

Some Bigs meet their Littles on the weekends. Others get together with their Littles in the evenings. Each match is unique and develops a schedule that works for them.

National and local studies show that children who have role models are more likely to improve in school and in their relationships with family and friends and less likely to skip school or use illegal drugs or alcohol. Students who are successful in school are less likely to drop out, abuse drugs or commit crimes. In fact, the success of children enrolled in Big Brothers Big Sisters was proven in a nationwide randomized study.

### Aglialoro Tutorial Academy (A.T.A.)

Site-based at Street School, New City. A tutorial program serving BBBS participants in need of extra curricula academic assistance.

### Big Bags Support(B.B.S.)

Program assistance to BBBS participants in the allocation of school supplies and necessities.

### Rockland County Mentoring Collaborative Program(R.C.M.C.)

### Site-based at Dominican College, 470 Western Highway, Orangeburg, NY 10962

Peer mentoring after school program serving high school students from Spring Valley High School who are low academic achievers with social/behavioral issues and at risk of not graduating high school.

Afterschool mentoring program serving 7–15 year old youth from the Village of Haverstraw. The Program focus is based on Life Skills, Anger Management, Bias Awareness, Conflict Resolution, Gang Prevention, and Career Preparedness.

### Juvenile Intervention Cyber-Bullying Education(J.U.I.CE.)

Adjunct curriculum to the J.U.M.P. Program offering preventive education on internet/ electronic persecution/harassment and emotional consequences caused to the victims.


### Court Ordered Supervised Visitation (C.O.S.V.)

- Site Based at Building A, Pomona Health Center, 50 Sanatorium Road, Pomona NY,
- Off-Site within the Community of Rockland
- Virtual Visitation
- Home Visits
- Safe Exchange

Family Court Judges grant Court Orders to non-custodial parents for visitation with their children. Visits are facilitated in a structured environment and supervised by court-approved child advocates. Reports of the visitation are provided to the courts as per Court Order requirements.

### Family Assistance Program(F.A.P.) Serving BBBS Families throughout all Rockland County **Communities**

Distribution of weekly household items, school supplies, camp scholarships, and pro bono extra curricula program activities as necessary to families throughout all of the Rockland County




